The guard ignored Paul and the ship sailed into hurricane strength winds and was tossed about for many days. Paul told them all that an angel of the Lord had told him that no one would die and that they would run aground on an island. Just as Paul said, the ship ran aground near the island of Malta and everyone got to shore safely. While there, Paul was bitten by a poisonous snake and miraculously lived. He also healed the father of the island's chief official. After three months they boarded another ship heading to Rome.

Emphasis: *God protected Paul and gave him strength. When we trust God he will do the same for us!*
