A Note from your Teachers:

Mrs. Hardison: We begin the New Year exploring winter! We will be discovering snow and snowmen as well as polar animals and how various animals adapt in the winter. Then we will be moving on to gingerbread men! We will be focusing on story details by comparing and contrasting different versions of the story of the Gingerbread Man, along with journaling about the story. We will be strengthening our math skills with sorting, counting, and patterning gingerbread men, and we will be honing our STEM skills with activities such as building gingerbread houses! What a busy and yummy month!

Mrs. Waugh: Welcome back to school! I hope everyone had a healthy and blessed holiday season. In January, we will be moving full speed ahead, starting with learning number recognition from 1-20, as well as learning to write the numbers. We will also be focusing on the concept of upper/lower case letters and supporting the children in using the appropriate letters when writing their names. We will be doing many activities to enhance their fine motor skills, which will help them to feel more confident holding writing materials and cutting with scissors. I will be having a children's sign in book in the classroom, so that each day when they enter they will be signing their names before sitting down to circle time. This is also a good time to start introducing at home the learning of writing their last name (for the kiddies who already know how to write their first names). We will then follow through and encourage them at school to do the same. The letter of the week share activity will continue, with N, O, P, and Q being the letters in January. The children always love learning about animals, so we learn about the habits and life-cycles of hibernating animals, and the winter weather. Finally, I will be introducing the concept of rhythm to the children, using various musical instruments and special songs to help build this skill.

Mrs. Micallef: Pre-K January Theme: Sunshine and Snowflakes

This month we will explore the four seasons. We will learn about the differences between the seasons, what the weather and the environment is like at the different times of the year, and how people and animals adapt to the different seasons. The students will also learn that different places in the world experience seasons differently; some places do not get any snow in the winter, and some places get hotter than others in the summer. Additionally we will learn that the seasons in the Southern Hemisphere (or southern half of the world) are different from here; they have winter when we have summer. You are encouraged to talk to your child about the types of weather s/he has experienced; we will have ample opportunities to read books about the subject, discuss, and journal our learning.

Mrs. Wohlfarth: Hello! During the month of January we will dive into winter! Will will be creating winter art, making shaving cream snowmen, and doing a little winter cleaning in our garden. I hope you have enjoyed tasting some fresh lettuce from our school garden. Once we have cleaned out the garden we will need to plant new seeds. Feel free to have your child bring in plants or seeds they would like to donate to our garden!

I'm so happy to say that I had at least one parent volunteer on the playground everyday in he month of December. You guys are amazing! Let's keep home and school connection going in the month of January. I will have a sign up sheet out this week. Thanks!
