### INVESTIGATING THE WORLD AROUND US

Coming across a recent article on promoting inquiry with young children, recent research has underscored young children's capacity for science learning (NRC 2012). Long before they enter kindergarten, children generate ideas about the world and how it works based on evidence from their own experiences. These early theories, although often inaccurate scientifically (all round things sink; balls can roll by themselves), represent a rudimentary understanding of science concepts across content areas, including physics. As they seek to make sense of their world, young children also reason in ways that are foundational to later scientific thinking (Center on the Developing Child 2011; NRC 2012).

As the school year is steadily proving, our students at OSLS Preschool are constantly stimulated as they are developing their own experiences and understandings of the world around them! We have the privilege of giving our students investigation tools and concepts so they may become

independent thinkers and have inquisitive spirits that will last a life time in their development and education!

Take some time to be an investigator with your child-engage, explore and reflect with your child their discoveries and findings! You may find your own curiosity in this beautiful relationship of investigating and discovery in the world around you is just as exciting!

For Pre-K children, their family is the center of their world. The purpose of this second unit is to help children think about and explore the concept of family; their own families as families around the world. While focusing on this theme, children will explore different elements of the family unit; they will listen to selections and engage in activities that focus on the characteristics that families share and the things that make families unique. We will also be learning about the people who make up families and the relationships among them. Through reading and discussing, we will be helping children understand that the affection that family members have for one another is what truly distinguishes a family. Consider discussing your own family to help your child understand the relationships among family members. Identifying family members with words such as *aunt*, *uncle*, *grandparent*, and *cousin* will help reinforce your child's understanding of family-relationship words.
