During the 2014 TED conference, National Teacher of the Year Award winner Rob Stephenson gave his compelling speech on the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) in today's classroom. Stephenson's strategies gave teachers across the country and even here at Our Savior's the inspiration to continue to strive for excellence in the classroom as well as empowering our students to be complex problem solvers.

Allowing a child to solve problems is sometimes a challenge for us adults for a typical child will solve problems with busy hands, energetic minds, and messy spaces. This challenge when looked through the
